


Story Time:

At Hitherfield Primary School, Story Time sessions are integral to our curriculum, designed to promote a love of literature and reading for pleasure. Research shows that children who are read to daily are more likely to read independently for pleasure. Across all year groups from Nursery to Year 6, our daily Story Time sessions feature a rich variety of genres and forms, with core texts aligned to our Reading Progression Framework. After exploring core texts, teachers supplement these with additional books that reflect both term themes and class interests. We also integrate themed books throughout the year, including those for Pride Month and anti-bullying initiatives, coordinated with our PHSE and anti-racism leads. These efforts ensure that reading is integral to our educational approach, fostering a deep appreciation for diversity and varied experiences among our students.

<u>Hitherfield Heroes:</u>

For the last two years, we have had incredible success with our Hitherfield Heroes volunteer reading programme, ensuring that every class in the school has at least one volunteer reader from the community each week. The Hitherfield Heroes read with three children per session, chosen by the class teacher. This one-on-one reading has an incredible impact, helping to build inherent motivation, fluency, and comprehension.

Feedback from both pupils and volunteers has been overwhelmingly positive, with 100 percent of survey respondents stating that they enjoyed the experience and felt that it was beneficial.

Additionally, the library is open on designated days after school, providing a calm space for children to share a book with their adults, with our brilliant librarian available to assist.

Assemblies:







In term three, our Story Time sessions focus on performance poetry, culminating in our annual poetry assembly. Here, representatives from each class showcase one of the poems they have learned, building their repertoire of literary works and celebrating the art form of poetry. This event both promotes public speaking skills and builds appreciation for the creative expression found in poetry.

Additionally, every term, we host dedicated book assemblies where a member of the Senior Leadership Team or another staff member shares and discusses a newly discovered book. These assemblies model positive reading behaviors, such as exploring new genres and authors, and inspire students to expand their reading horizons. These assemblies reinforce our commitment to nurturing a community of enthusiastic readers and lifelong learners at Hitherfield Primary School. We also hold a World Book Day assembly every year.



Book Fairs and Author Visits:

We enrich our reading for pleasure offer with a variety of Book Fairs and Author Visits. Throughout the year, we host age-appropriate author visits, aiming to feature a diverse range of authors. As well as this our after-school book fairs are organised in collaboration with anti-racist and multicultural retailers, as well as large publishing houses, ensuring a wide selection of inclusive and engaging books for our students.
